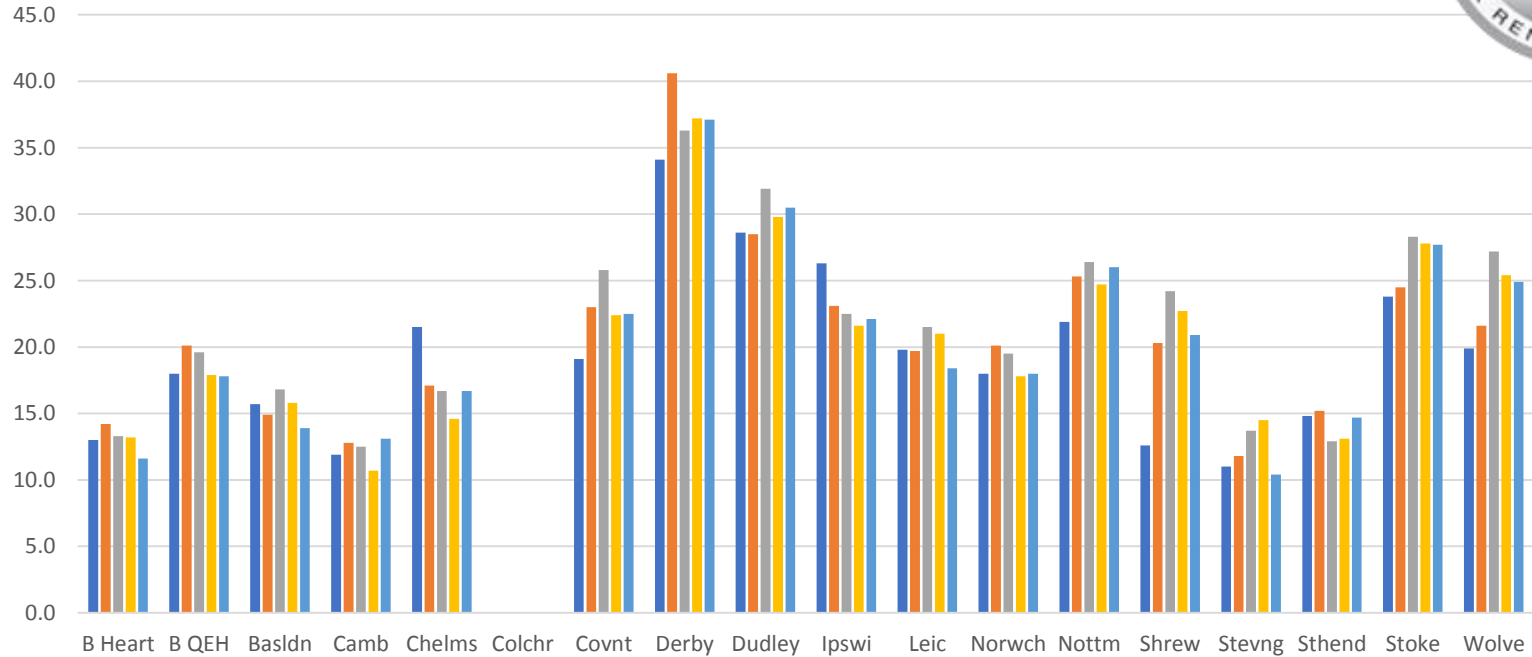

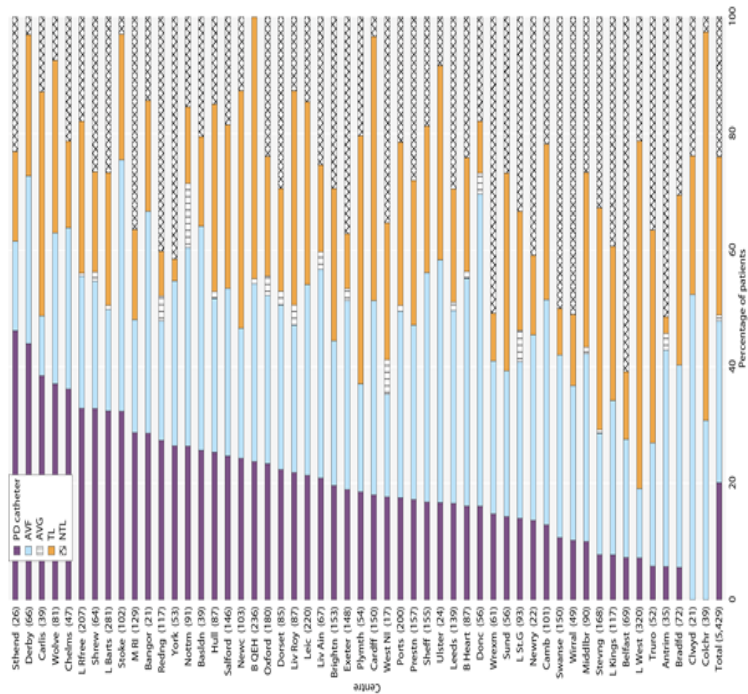

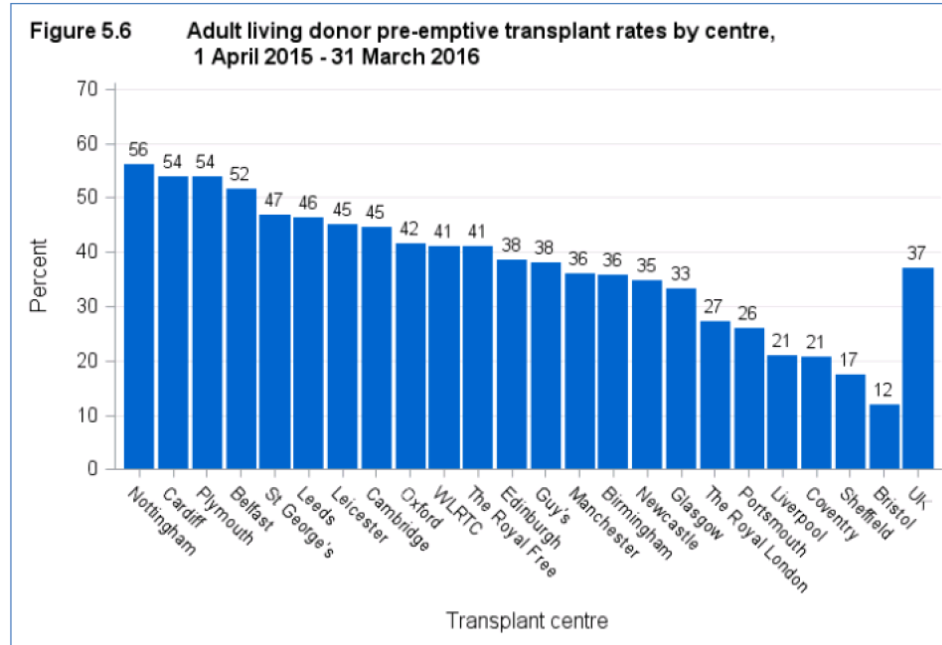
Home Dialysis: UK Renal Registry

Why does unwarranted variation persist?

Many reasons:

- Some specific to each Unit-solutions can only come from those at coal face-you know your system best

- Some systematic
 - Resource?
 - Training in QI methodology
 - Leadership & leadership training
 - Structure
 - We don't share good practice (or learn from less good practice)

- Know where to turn to for further support

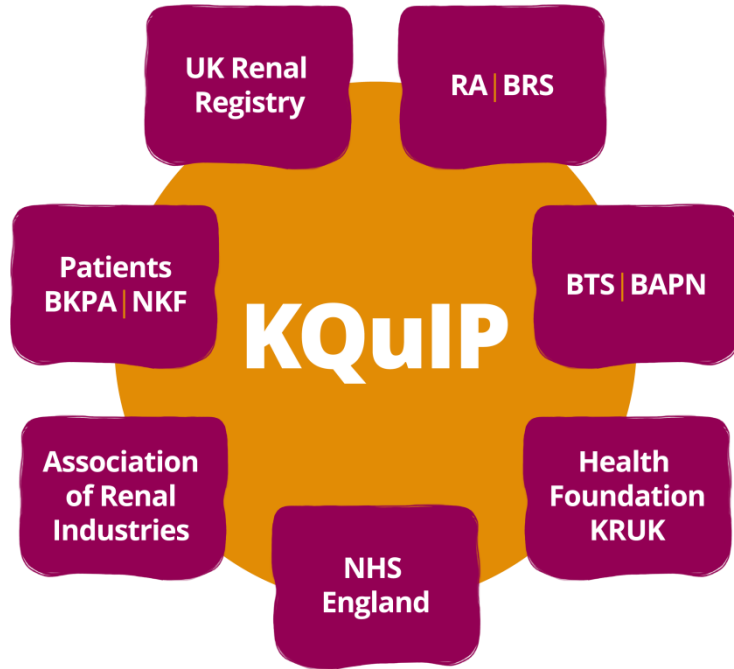
